





CAROLYN'S GARDEN TIPS

I hope you've all had a nice summer & enjoyed the good weather in your gardens. It's been a tough time for the gardens & gardeners, not having much rain, plus the hose pipe ban! Now, as summer draws into autumn, the perennials in your garden will be starting to lose vibrancy, ready to go dormant over winter. You may want to increase the amount of plants you have, or give some to a friend, & now is a great time to propagate perennials by division. It's very easy & requires little effort to divide plants. Simply dig up a clump of the perennial(s) that you wish to propagate, using a spade. Having a tarpaulin or plastic sheet to place the clump on saves getting soil everywhere; empty compost bags are great for this. The best way to divide the clump is to place two garden forks butted up to each other, back to back, into the clump, then push each fork away from the other, hence pushing the clump in two. This can be done to divide the clump into sections that are the size you require to plant them elsewhere, or to pot them up & grow on. You can also use this method to reduce the size of the original clump if it has got too big for the area it was planted in. You can split perennials up with a spade, cutting them into required sized sections, but you will sever & lose a lot of roots; the back to back fork method teases the plant clump apart, keeping more root matter.

If replanting the clump(s) into the garden, make sure they are well watered as they will have lost roots being split up. Equally, if you have potted up the divided plant sections, water them in too, as they will be relying on you for their care, being out of the ground. However, don't over water the plants, as they need encouragement to grow new roots, which they will do in their search for water/nutrients. Obviously, plants in pots will require attention until they start to grow again in spring, watering a little if necessary so they don't completely dry out, using weeding, if required, to get rid of competing vegetation.

Labelling plants is important so you can remember what you've planted where, or what is in each plant pot if you've potted them up.

You may want to give unwanted sections of the plant(s) to a friend without potting them up, but make sure the section is kept moist & get them to plant it in their garden straight away (the empty compost bags come in handy for this too, for easy transportation/moisture retention).

Check the plants in spring to make sure they have taken root & are shooting, as there is a danger they may rot in winter/get damaged by bad frosts. To insure against this, you could keep some of your divided plants in pots. These would be easier to check on as you can see new roots emerging out of the drainage holes. If none are visible, you can gently tip the plant out of the pot to check for new roots in Spring; you can carefully repot the plant afterwards. Always wait until the plant has an established root system before planting out, or potting into a larger pot.

So, virtually free plants then, apart from a little work, some pots, labels & compost. Oh, one last thing....be careful, don't go through your toes with the forks!



DID YOU KNOW?

With *The East Wolds Community Newsletter* covering a variety of villages, Adam Kelly decided to investigate the various areas for interesting facts - this issue he looks at Butterwick, Foxholes and Kilham.

BUTTERWICK

- The name Butterwick means "butter-specialised farm", derived from the Old English butere (butter) and wīc (a building or collection of buildings for special purposes).
- Despite its name, the main crop of Butterwick today is potatoes. As recently as 1892, the chief crops were wheat, oats, barley, and turnips.



FOXHOLES

- In 1868, Foxholes boasted not only farmland but also a brass and iron foundry, offering local employment.
- St Mary's Church was entirely rebuilt in 1866 by George Fowler Jones in a bold Neo-Norman style. Despite being Grade II listed for its architectural significance, Nikolaus Pevsner, author of The Buildings of



England, called the church "one of the ugliest in the Riding".

KILHAM

- Kilham once had a large stone in its marketplace carved with Maltese crosses. According to legend, it was moved to Harpham Fields during a visitation of the plague, to allow trading away from the infected town. After serving its purpose, it was relocated to Lowthorpe.
- Sir Benjamin Fonseca Outram was born in Kilham in 1774. Son of Captain William Outram, he joined the Medical Naval Service and became Medical Inspector of Her Majesty's Fleets and Hospitals. He was knighted in 1850.
- On the last Wednesday in June, the Foresters' Feast was held in Kilham. The Kilham Foresters Society (1856-1955) was one of many benefit clubs and friendly societies that started in the 1800s.
- During the Second World War, the Army established a small Pigeon Corps at Kilham to practice message training.
- In the early 1800s, Kilham banned football after rowdy inter-village matches (played with pig bladders and no rules) got out of hand. Dozens of men would battle to bring the ball back to their home village, even if it was miles away. The ban followed Methodist objections to it being played on Sundays.



THE RECIPE BOOK

PEAR DESSERT

If like me you like a quick dessert that takes very little thought, here's another one from the 365 Good Reasons to Sit Down to Eat recipe book. If you've been given lots of pears this year, here's a really good quick dessert. I have also made this with peaches. The aroma fills the house!

Ingredients:

6 good pears

1 vanilla pod or vanilla essence (to taste)

1 litre of red wine (35 fluid ounces, 4 cups)

1 teaspoon back peppercorns (I don't always put this in)

150g 5.5oz soft brown sugar

4 star anise

3 sticks cinnamon

(Don't forget you can alter all this to suit your taste.)

Essential kit:

Large pan

Method:

Peel the pears and keep the stalks attached.

Add contents of vanilla pod to the red wine.

Place the pears in a large pan with the vanilla wine. Add the sugar, star anise and cinnamon.

Cook uncovered over a gentle heat for 45 mins.

When cool allow the pears to infuse in the fridge for 24 hours.

Serve with ice cream, fresh whipped cream or creme fraiche

Cooking time: 45 minutes in the oven around 140° (I turn the oven way down and leave it a bit longer)

A planning application has been submitted for a temporary gas wellsite north of Butt Lane, Foxholes.

Our small North Yorkshire parish, the villages of Foxholes and Butterwick, has voted overwhelmingly to oppose Egdon Resources' gas drilling plans.

Because the proposal is to drill straight through a principal chalk aquifer, a vital source of clean drinking water for 900,000 people across the region, all in the search for gas.


