CHURCHILL IN THE WOLDS

Recently a chance encounter with a striking black-and-white photo on a local Facebook page changed how I view the quiet fields around Butterwick. The image showed tanks lined up across farmland in the Yorkshire Wolds, with a caption hinting at a wartime inspection. Intrigued, I dug a bit deeper and discovered just how crucial this landscape was to the success of D-Day.

In 1943, large areas of the Yorkshire Wolds were requisitioned for intensive armoured training. Thousands of sheep were sold in emergency auctions to clear ground between Duggleby, Sherburn, Foxholes, Fridaythorpe, and Butterwick. Well-known old Wold families such as Megginson, Sawdon, Byass, Raines, Grice, Conner, Cundall, Smedley, Cussons and Scruton sacrificed their herds and fields for the war effort, although the government did ensure they were given a fair deal. Hedges were removed and fields flattened to create realistic practice terrain for the tanks and crews who would spearhead the Normandy landings. Units such as the East Riding Yeomanry trained here, honing the skills they later used on Sword Beach.



The unique Wolds countryside proved perfect for large-scale manoeuvres and live-firing exercises. One memorable highlight was Winston Churchill's early-morning visit. Local accounts describe him reviewing tanks and men positioned in fields near Butterwick and Weaverthorpe as part of final preparations. The Prime Minister, a longtime champion of armoured warfare, took a personal interest in ensuring British forces were ready for the greatest invasion in history.

Today the Wolds look peaceful once more, but those gaps in the hedges, distant tank tracks and fading memories remind us how even the quietest corners of Britain played their part in liberating Europe.

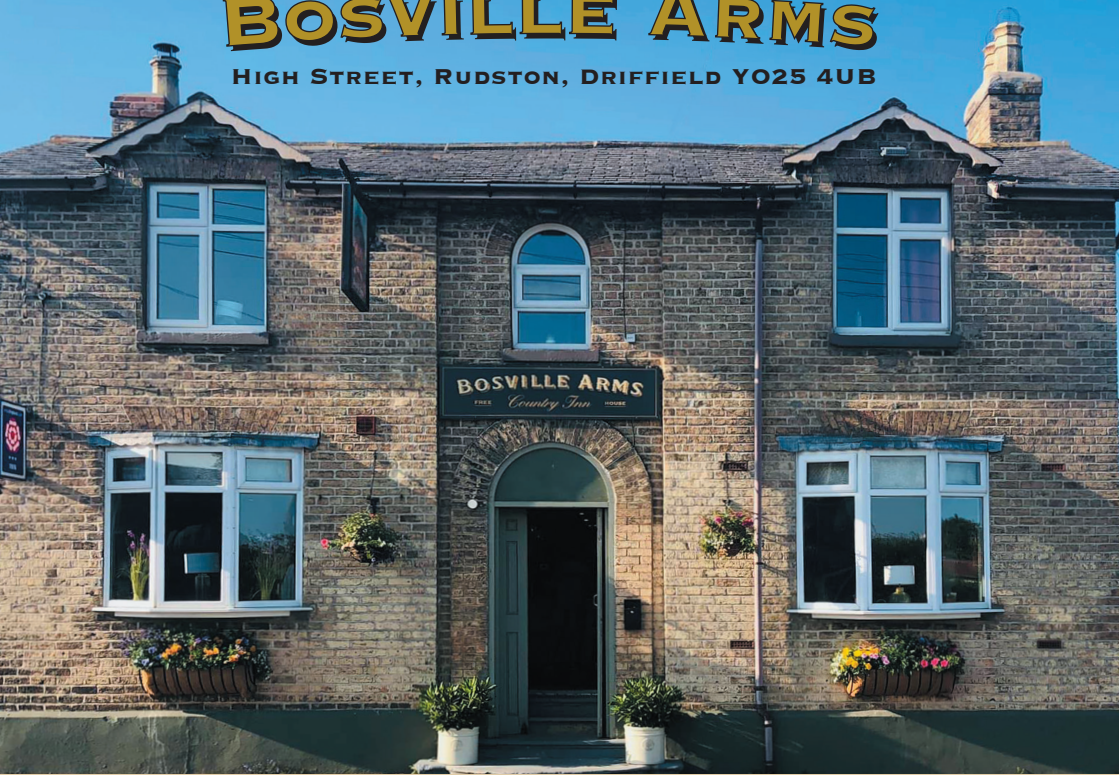

THE RECIPE BOOK

STICKY PORK BELLY SLICES SANDWICH

When the weather is so hot, nobody wants to spend a lot of time cooking. This quick and simple sandwich is short on prep, but big on taste!

Ingredients:

500g pork belly slices

For the BBQ sauce

4 tbsp ketchup

1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce

1 tbsp light brown sugar

1 tbsp cider vinegar

1 tbsp dark soy sauce

1 tsp English mustard

1 clove garlic (crushed)

Essential Kit:

Roasting tin.



Method:

Heat the oven to 160C/fan 140C/gas mark 4.

Dry the belly slices with kitchen paper, then season with salt and pepper.

Mix together the ingredients for the sauce and toss the slices in the sauce in a roasting tin.

Cover tightly with foil and roast for 1hr 30mins, until completely tender.

Remove the foil and turn the grill to its highest setting. Grill the meat for 3-4 mins, turning it halfway and brushing over the sauce from the tin, until the sauce is thick and sticky and the slices are charred. Alternatively, put the braised slices on the barbecue and baste in the sauce from the roasting pan as they sizzle away.

Serve in buns with coleslaw.

HUMMUS

What better when it's hot outside than a tasty dip? This hummus is exactly what you need!

Ingredients:

2 x 400 g cans chick peas, drained
2–3 garlic cloves, coarsely chopped
1 tbsp tahini paste, or to taste
3 tbsp olive oil, or to taste
Juice of 1 lemon, or to taste
Salt and black pepper

Instructions

Purée the chick peas, garlic, tahini paste, oil, and lemon juice in a food processor or blender until smooth.

Add salt and pepper to taste, and more oil, tahini, and lemon juice if you think it needs it, then purée again.



Spoon into dishes. If you like, garnish with rosemary, red pepper, and olives.

FROZEN MARGARITA

A nice refreshing drink to wash it down is always a good idea - and here's a winner!

Ingredients:

50ml tequila
25ml triple sec (we used Cointreau)
25ml lime juice
15ml sugar syrup
Large handful of ice
Wedge of lime to garnish



Method:

Put all the ingredients except the lime wedge in a blender and blitz until smooth. Tip into a cocktail, margarita or rocks glass, garnish and serve.
